Notes:

- The School operates a minimum booking policy, which will apply as follows as your child moves through the ELS:
 - Stage 4 (pre-school): 3 days per week
 - Children accessing all types of funding: 3 days per week
 - All other children: 2 days per week
- The Extended Week rate is for children booked full time, all year round for an academic year. The special discounted rate. This rate is based on the principle of a committed booking schedule for the whole academic year. Parents wishing to exit this booking pattern prior to the end of the academic year, either by changing the booking pattern, or by serving notice, will be required to pay an additional charge to exit this commitment.
- Ad hoc day bookings may be offered based on availability. We aim to accommodate where we can and request as much notice as possible to facilitate this. A minimum of 48 hours' notice must be given for cancellation, which will incur an administrative charge of £5.00. Ad hoc sessions may sometimes be billed in arrears.
- Late collection fees apply for children collected after their pre-booked collection time; please also refer to our Late Collection Policy. Fees applied are as follows:
 - £15 for each 20 minutes beyond 4pm
 - £20 for each 15 minutes beyond 6pm

- Registration and Acceptance Fees:
 - On registering your child, a non-refundable registration fee of £125 is required.
 - On acceptance of our offer of a place, an acceptance deposit of £500 is required, which will be retained until the child leaves.
- Fees are inclusive of all milk, nappies, meals and snacks as appropriate. Formula milk is provided up to the age of 12 months; we would anticipate most babies would then move on to cow's milk which we provide. The ELS provides a particular brand of formula milk, wipes and nappies; if parents prefer a different type of each then they are welcome to provide their own.
- Fees are calculated monthly in advance and due on or before the first day of the month to which they relate. Late fees may be applied to overdue accounts.
- Parents with more than one child in the school will qualify for a sibling discount of 5% for the second child, and the third and subsequent children will receive a 10% discount. It is the School's policy that fee remissions do not aggregate; only the largest will apply at any one time.
- Please see the RHB Funding for Parents which provides further information in relation to Early Years Funding Entitlement.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for children below five years of age. We also support the government Tax-free Childcare scheme.

NOTES:

- All fees for each Term are due and payable as cleared funds before the commencement of the School Term to which they relate. Late fees: the rate of interest charged will be at up to 1.5% per month accruing on a daily basis and will be applied to all overdue accounts.
- The above fees are inclusive of some stationery, lunches, snacks and Personal Accident Insurance. Where a child is in receipt of a scholarship, or financial assistance, the discount will be applied excluding the cost of lunches and Insurance. For the academic year 2024/25 this amount is £410 per term.
- For UK Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of £1500 is required to accept the offered place.
- For EU Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of £1500 for day students is required to accept the offered place.
- For International students, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of a term's fees is required to accept the offered place. Should a Child Student visa be required, a payment of fees in advance will be required. Please contact the Registrar for more details.
- Parents with more than one child in the school will qualify for a sibling discount of 5% for the second child and the third and subsequent children will receive a 10% discount. It is the School's policy that fee remissions do not aggregate; only the largest will apply at any one time.
- Extended Hours sessions require a minimum of 48 hours' notice, and these may sometimes be billed in arrears.
- Rechargeable extras include additional charges which will be made for some school textbooks, educational trips, instrumental lessons, learning support and some after school activities.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for children below five years of age, and hours outside of the core day for children up to their 16th birthday.

- All fees for each Term are due and payable as cleared funds before the commencement of the School Term to which they relate. Late fees: the rate of interest charged will be at up to 1.5% per month accruing on a daily basis and will be applied to all overdue accounts.
- The above fees are inclusive of some stationery, lunches, snacks and Personal Accident Insurance. Where a child is in receipt of a scholarship, or financial assistance, the discount will be applied excluding the cost of lunches and Insurance. For the academic year 2024/25 this amount is £410 per term.
- For UK Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of £1500 is required to accept the offered place. For Boarding students, an additional Boarding deposit of £1000 is required.
- For EU Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of £1500 for day students is required to accept the offered place. For Boarding students, an additional Boarding deposit of £2500 is required.
- For International students, on registering your child, a registration fee of £125 is requested and a deposit of a term's fees (boarding or day) is required to accept the offered place. Should a Child Student or Student visa be required, a payment of fees in advance will be required. Please contact the Registrar for more details.
- Parents with more than one child in the school will qualify for a sibling discount of 5% for the second child and the third and subsequent children will receive a 10% discount. It is the School's policy that fee remissions do not aggregate; only the largest will apply at any one time.
- Flexi boarding charges do not provide for laundry services.
- Extended Hours sessions and ad hoc boarding require a minimum of 48 hours' notice, and these may sometimes be billed in arrears.
- A term's notice is required for a change from regular boarding to day status, otherwise the boarding fee will be charged for the remainder of the term.
- Rechargeable extras include additional charges which will be made for some school textbooks, educational trips, DofE participation, CCF fees, instrumental lessons, learning support and some after school activities.
- The main external examinations are charged in the final term of Year 11 and Year 13. Examinations outside of this term, such as early entries or re-sits will be charged in the term in which they are due.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for hours outside of the core day for children up to their 16th birthday.
- INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS - We operate an inclusive EAL fee structure to ensure that our International Students receive the best start to their studies in the UK.
 - Non-native speakers will be required to undertake our intensive group English Support Lessons until their English is of the level required for study at the appropriate age.
 - * IELTS exam fee and the ESL GCSE exam fee are not included in the price of the tuition and will be billed separately.

UK, EU OR INTERNATIONAL STUDENT DEFINITIONS

HOME (UK) STUDENTS

To be considered as a home (UK) student you normally need to meet all the following criteria on the first day of the first academic year of the course:

- You are settled in the UK (this means there is no immigration restriction on the length of your stay)
- You are ordinarily resident in the UK and have been for the full three years before the first day of the academic year. Ordinarily resident means that your main home is in the UK, and you are choosing to live in the UK.
- The main reason for you being in the UK was not to receive full-time education.

HOME (EU) STUDENTS

You will be considered as a home (EU) student if, on the first day of the first academic year of your course:

- You are an EU national, or the relevant family member of a non-UK EU national, who is in the UK as a self-sufficient person or as a student, or the relevant family member of a UK national.
- You must have been ordinarily resident in the European Economic Area and/or Switzerland and/or the overseas territories for the three years before the first day of the first academic year of the course.
- For students who are non-native English speakers an additional English Language test will be required for entry and this will determine whether the Intensive English support classes are required. This is at the sole discretion of the Academic Support Department.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

If you do not fall under the home (UK) or home (EU) fee definitions, then you will be considered as an international student.

For students who are non-native English speakers an additional English Language test will be required for entry and this will determine whether the Intensive English support classes are required. This is at the sole discretion of the Academic Support Department. The length of the support will vary according to the level of English of the Student and the courses of study.
